How can I be a peacemaker?

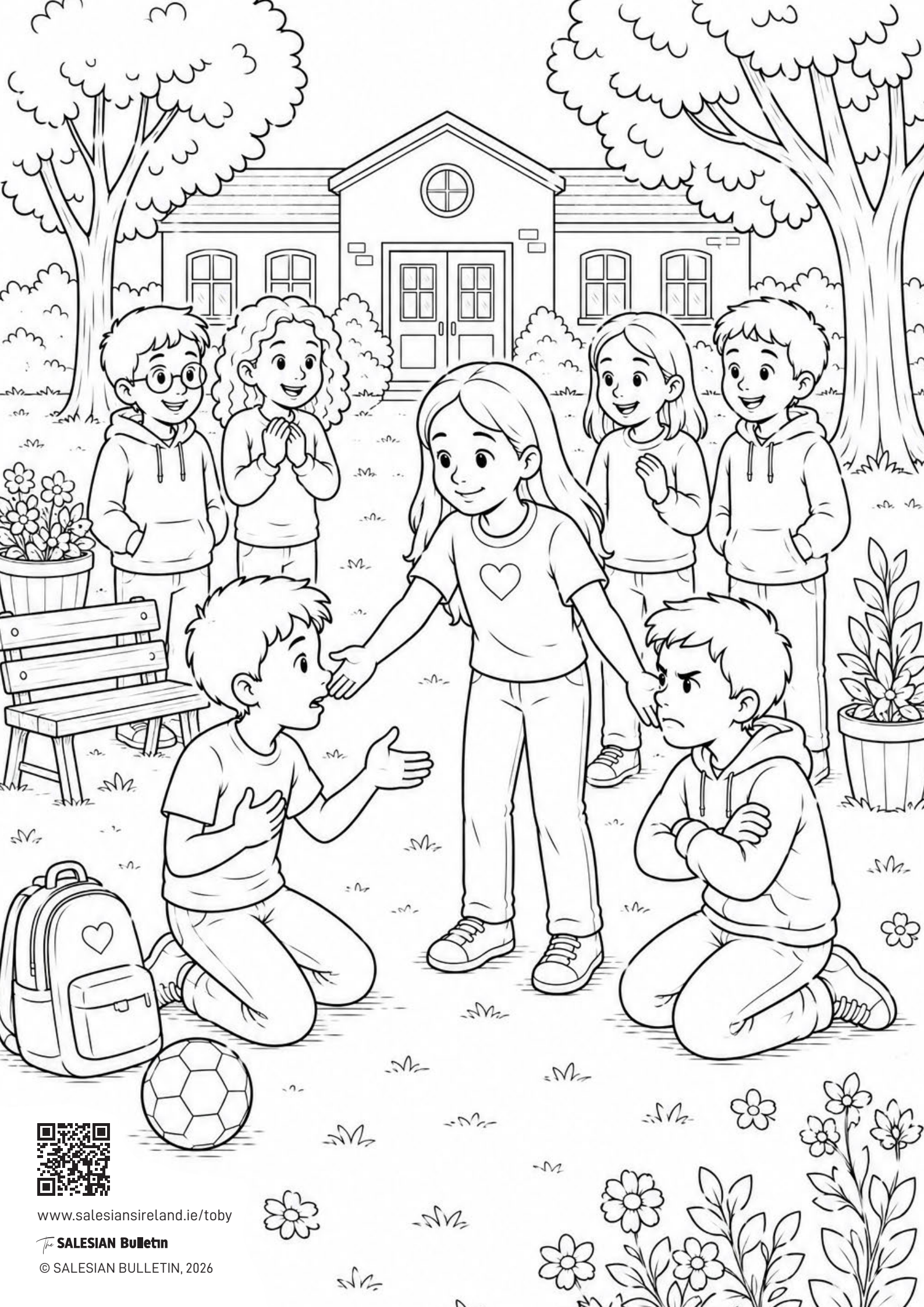
